Moment of reflection during challenging times

From "Everything Everywhere All at Once" winning seven Oscars to Iwen Chu being elected as one of the first Asian American women in the New York Senate, our community is making history in 2023.

But these successes and Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month also come at a fraught moment of rising anti-Asian hate crimes. Two years after the Atlantic spa shootings, we've seen back-to-back mass shootings in California earlier this year and the Texas outlet mall shooting on Sunday.

As an AAPI journalist covering underrepresented communities in the United States, I often find these moments hard to process in the newsroom—and I know others have expressed similar feelings. With that in mind, the AAJA-NY board has been working to offer a safe space for members to connect with mental health experts.

We've launched a mental health series to hold conversations about showing up in the world as Asian Americans. We hope you find support and community in these challenging times. The theme for this year's AAPI month is "Advancing Leaders Through Opportunity." For many of us in the media industry, the sweeping job cuts have left us with uncertainty, but I am happy to see that many of you have used our Slack group to support your fellow AAPI journalists and offer job opportunities. We will continue to highlight noteworthy jobs in our jobs section of this newsletter.
